

WILLIAM T.(HOMAS) HARTGROVE

William T. Hartgrove, 86, Bunker Hill, was pronounced dead on arrival at Dukes Hospital at 9:30 p.m. Sunday. (December 4, 1966) His death was unexpected and was thought to have been due to a heart attack.

He was a former field manager for Schlosser Bros. Creamery for several years. In recent years he had been employed as fire chief at Bunker Hill, as town marshal and mail carrier in Bunker Hill.

He had spent his lifetime in Miami County.

Mr. Hartgrove was born July 7, 1880, the son of William and Willie Ann Acree Hartgrove. He was married Jan. 20, 1906 at Logansport to Maude Mae Jackson who died July 18, 1954.

Surviving are four daughters and three sons, Mrs. C. G. Locke, Irving, Texas; Mrs. Noel Little, Mrs. Chester Garbert and William T. Hartgrove, Jr. Peru; Mrs. Elmer Calhoun, Miami and Robert J. Hartgrove, Bunker Hill; 23 grandchildren and 39 great-grandchildren.

Mr. Hartgrove was a member of the Miami Methodist Church and was a charter member of the Red Men Lodge, Miami.

Funeral services will be in the Allen Funeral Home, Bunker Hill at 2 p.m. Thursday. The Rev. Lowell Schultz and the Rev. Francis Gough will officiate and burial will be in the Galveston Cemetery. Friends may call at the funeral home after 10 a.m. Wednesday.
