Racing legend **Bob Harkey** died last week, prompting Peru resident John Fugate to reminisce about the race car driver's affection for Peru. "(Bob) drove the Peru Circus Special in the Indianapolis 500," Fugate said. "He finished eighth in it in 1972 and finished in the top-10 three times there." The car was sponsored by the local Rotary Club after Lindsay Hopkins, the car's owner, made the request at a Rotary meeting, Fugate recalled. Ten people gave up \$1,000-a-piece. "That worked out as it was a very cheap sponsorship," Fugate continued. "We drove Harkey and his chief mechanic crazy every day. At the time, I was the assistant director of PR at the Speedway and several of us would walk in and tell them there was a package of shoes and noses in there for them. They always told us not to start that up and we'd get a big laugh out of it." Fugate said the car is no longer put together and was likely, "in a million pieces but there's someone in Indiana who still has that car, I believe."

Fugate moved to Peru after working at the Indianapolis Speedway. He ran Chamber of Commerce for 10 years, announced youth circus 14 years, including the comeback appearance in old timers show this fall, and has been on the board of directors of Circus Hall of Fame for 35 years. The importance of Peru's sponsorship of Harkey's car is not something that can be easily determined, according to Fugate, who was not yet a resident here at the time of the sponsorship. "I don't know how much impact that had on the circus, but I'm sure it did," Fugate said. "I was aware there was a circus in Peru but I didn't come up here to see it until about 1973 or 1974."

When Fugate did come to see the circus, he brought Tony Hulman George, Tony Hulman's grandson, with him. Hulman was the owner of the Indianapolis Speedway, purchasing it in 1945 and credited with helping to bring racing back after World War II.

Hulman invited Peru children to the Speedway after a visit here, and the children were able to meet many of the drivers, including Harkey. "Bob really became enamored with the kids, he and his wife, along with Pancho Carter," Fugate added. "They would come to the circus every summer. Bob was invited to drive in the parade in his uniform and helmet, which he did many times," Fugate recalled. "The last time he was here, the summer before last (2014), he brought his Auburn Cord Duesenberg up . It was a beautiful silver and dark maroon car," Fugate continued. "It was a kit car, mostly fiberglass, but it still sells for around \$50,000."

He also helped out with other endeavors, including a Chamber of Commerce car show, Fugate recalled.

"The people appreciated him," Fugate said. "The Chamber had a car show every year to keep it afloat and Bob, Pancho and several other drivers would come and flocked to him because he was a popular guy."

Harkey passed away Saturday, Jan. 16. He was 85.

A popular Indy race driver, he competed in the Indianapolis 500 six times between 1964 and 1976 and finished in the top ten three times. He was one of only 11 drivers still living who could claim to have driven in the "500" with a front-engined car, according to his obituary. He was one of only eight survivors who had started with both a front-engine and a rear-engine car He was one of only six living drivers who could claim a top 10 finish with both. In February 1959, he took part in the very first event at the then-brand new Daytona International Speedway. He loved open-wheel racing of sprint cars and midgets. He competed in 84 USAC (United States Auto Club) National Championship events between 1963 and 1979. Indianapolis Motor Speedway boss Doug Boles issued a statement on Harkey's passing: "Bob Harkey competed during one of the most transformative times in Indianapolis 500 history as the cars moved from rear-engine to front-engine and from no aerodynamic devices to wings and downforce. But what made Bob Harkey special was his continued involvement in and around the Speedway each May after his racing years. He always had time for our fans, young and old, and his passion for the Indianapolis 500 was evident in every fan interaction."

In addition to his storied racing career, he loved performing as an aerial stunt pilot. Always looking for a challenge, he performed as a stunt man in several motion pictures, and he even boxed as a professional. He performed all the stunts for Robert Mitchum in "Thunder Road;" was one of the drivers in "Winning," starring Paul Newman, Joanne Woodward and Robert Wagner, and also performed stunts in "Speedway" with Elvis Presley.

His love of people showed through as Harkey was part of Champion Spark Plug Company's Highway Safety program. He continued his volunteer work after retiring from racing, serving as a guest speaker, mentor and leader at schools, civic groups and community events. Fugate pointed out that Harkey's involvement with causes such as the Highway Safety Program were important to him.

"He would go out to schools and talk about highway safety to the kids," Fugate said. "He said if we save eve one life, this program is worthwhile. He did that for about 12 years."

One of Fugate's favorite memories of his friend does not involve racing but rather, airplanes. Harkey gave Fugate a few flying lessons. "We were in an AT-6, which was a primary World War II fighter trainer," Fugate reminisced. "We were hanging upside down over Pittsboro, Indiana. We both had shoots on and he said, 'If anything goes wrong, don't worry. Stay here and I'll go for help!'

"That sticks in my mind about Bob Harkey. He loved life, he loved people and not too many people can say that 'he did it my way," Fugate said. "I thank God that I became a good friend of his from 1963 on and I'm going to miss him."

Harkey is survived by wife Cheryl, a daughter, Robyn, and several cousins.
